ATS 2019 International Conference

- 6,862 abstracts, case reports
- Projected attendance is 15,000 from 102 countries; 13,500 professional
- Attendance is approximately 60-40% US vs. International
- 500++ educational sessions
- Key findings of landmark studies announced here first



RIS Addresses Important Opportunities and Gaps for the Field

- Most clinical researchers not taught entrepreneurial thinking
 - How to transition their important discoveries or ideas for new devices from the laboratory into clinical care?
 - How to connect with investors and build a new company?
- Panel discussions at RIS address these gaps and provide valuable time for smaller discussions



ATS Drug Device Discovery and Development Committee

- Focuses on basic, translational and clinical science surrounding the discovery and development of new drugs and devices, regardless of genesis or financial support
 - Members from industry, academia and the NIH
 - More than 10% of ATS members list a work-setting of “industry”
- “We believe it is important for the ATS to rededicate itself to fostering a scientific culture that values inclusiveness—a scientific “community of excellence.”
